Getting help where it's needed most



For the launch of our new Insights newsletter we revisit two of our recent stories that highlight how we are able to make a difference for the children and families at The Infants' Home.

Amalia: At five months old Amalia (pictured above with educator Sabrina) was diagnosed with dystonic cerebral palsy. This condition impacts all aspects her daily life, including her mobility (she uses a walker), her ability to eat, drink and swallow, her speech and her fine motor skills.

The Infants' Home's team of educators and allied health professionals worked tirelessly with Amalia, her parents and her external therapists to help Amalia to gain greater independence and to get ready for school. She learned to use the bathroom on her own and to drink independently from a cup, both of which were significant milestones for Amalia and her family.

This year Amalia successfully started at her local mainstream primary school with the support of The Infants' Home's dedicated team. Kirra and Jason: Parents Kirra and Jason* wanted to build a better life for themselves and their young children. Traumatic childhood experiences, including family violence and drug misuse, had left them emotionally scarred, and sometimes they made choices that compromised their family's wellbeing. It was hard for them to break this cycle.

The Infants' Home provided the family with transport and fee scholarships so that their two boys could regularly attend our preschool programs to get a head start in those crucial years before starting school. Their daughter was also supported with her start at primary school through our targeted transition to school program.

Our impact in 2018

- Over 2,000 children and their families accessed one or more of our services
- 83 postnatal visits were conducted as part of our postnatal home visiting program
- 751 children, parents and carers attend our supported community playgroups
- 133 children transitioned to primary school from our early education program
- 172 children participated in targeted integrated early intervention programs in our child care centres
- 156 Parents and carers attended our parenting courses and wellbeing programs
- 576 children attended our Early Childhood Education and Care centres
- **815** children attended our Family Day Care services
- 30% of our on site services are targeted to support children at risk, with vulnerabilities or with additional needs.
